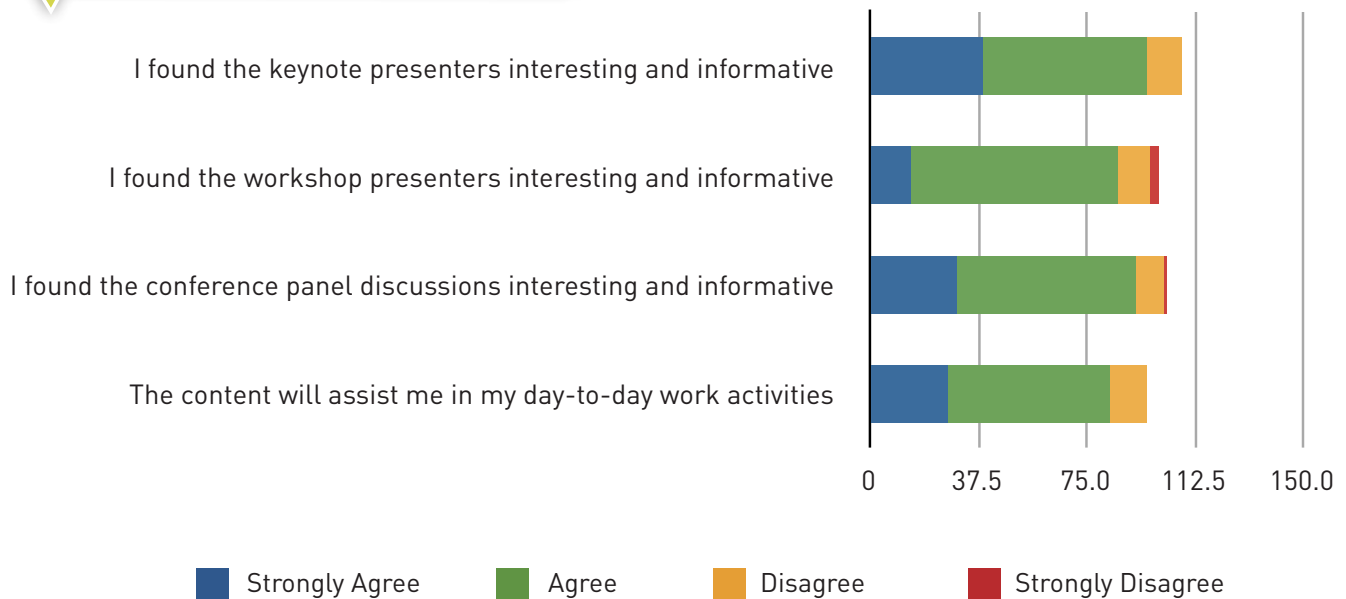

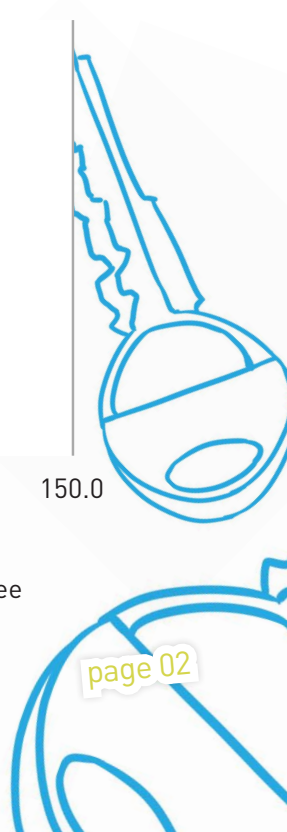
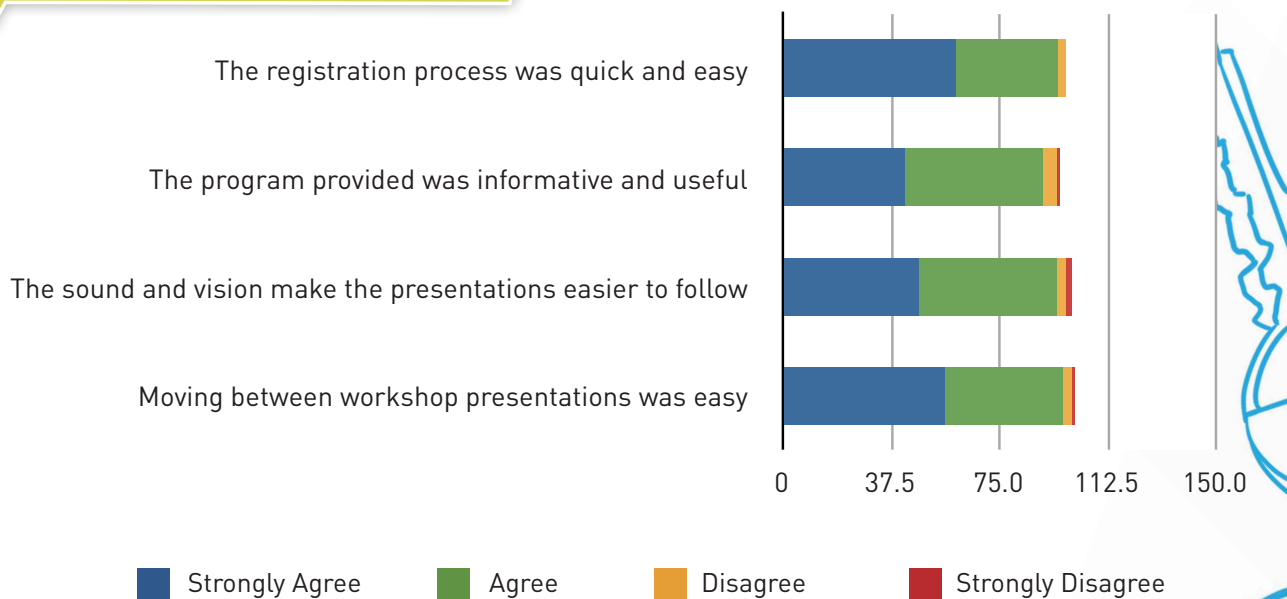

The following graphs detail feedback received from delegates attending “Interrupting Transmission: youth, change, policy and practice”

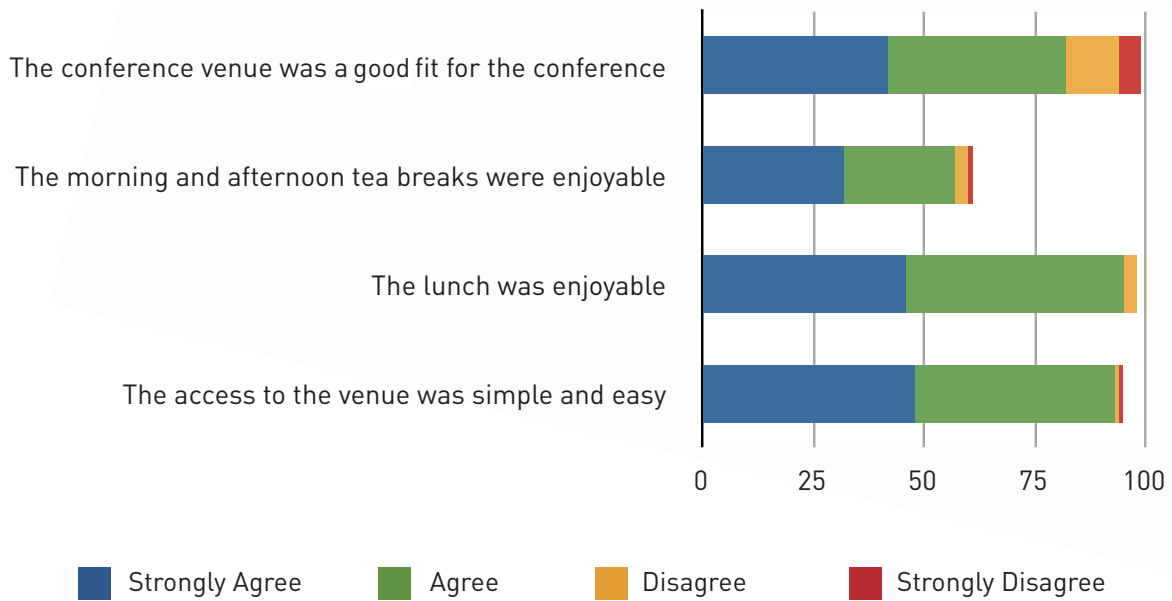
Program Content



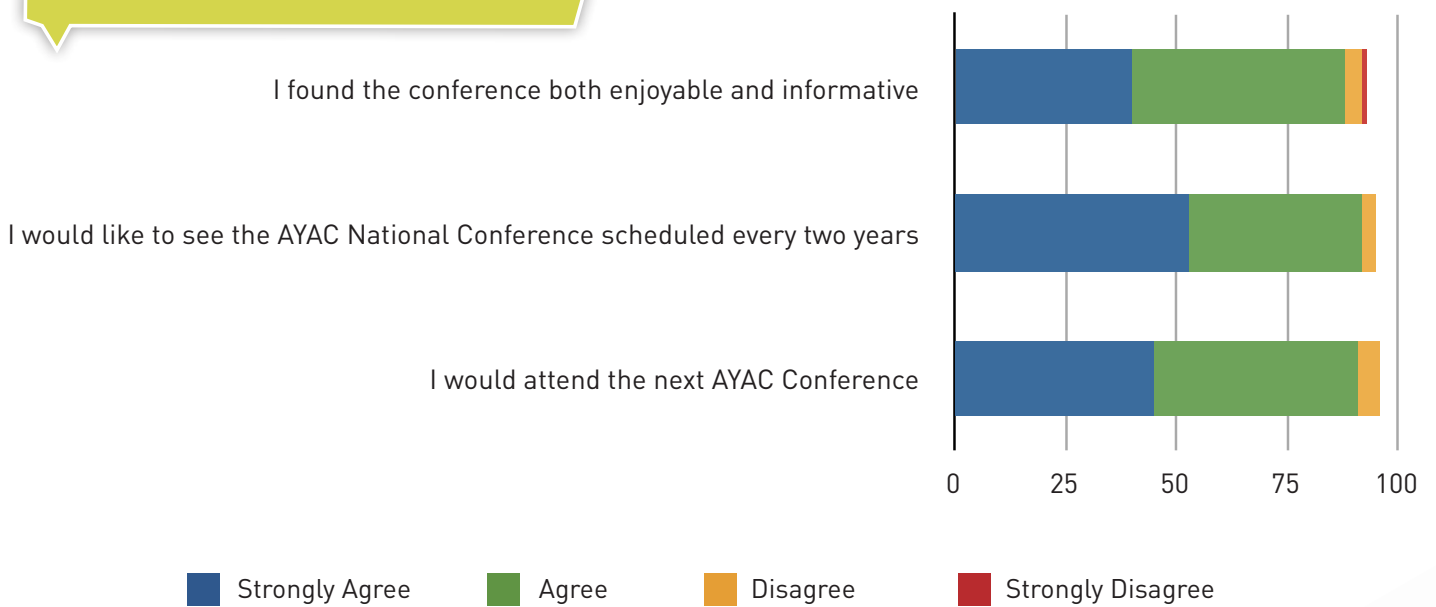
Coordination
